

# Trap Ranges

Trap shooters must comply with the following rules and procedures:

1. Observe CDC Routine Prevention Procedures and rules for use of the CRGC clubhouse or pavilion.
2. Minimize your time in the clubhouse or pavilion.
3. Maintain social distancing between shooters, and between shooters, instructors, and coaches, of at least 6 feet. No congregating on the trap pads.
4. Keep your personal items at your vehicle.
5. Team leaders and CRGC RSOs are responsible for monitoring and enforcing social distancing rules for compliance. High school team coaches are also responsible for monitoring and enforcing rules. Anyone not following the rules will be asked to leave.
6. Soap and water, hand sanitizer, and nitrile gloves are available in the clubhouse and pavilion – feel free to use them when handling non-personal items (e.g. loading traps, using loaner guns, score boards, cash, etc.)
7. Any CRGC equipment must be cleaned and sanitized by the user before returning the item(s) to the cashier's window or the place from which it was taken.
8. Team leaders or coaches should represent their groups inside the clubhouse for scheduling or other activities. It is generally not necessary for individuals to enter or stay in the clubhouse or pavilion.
9. For high school trap, and other groups, the following also applies:
  - a. Team captain or coaches will do the necessary scheduling, signups, or transactions at the cashier's window, and obtaining materials (shotshells, ear plugs, eye protection, etc.) and take it outside to the pavilion (and return the material when they are done).
  - b. Coaches assign squads and start times prior to arrival. Student athletes report to their assigned trap field and shooting position. This ensures distancing and exceeds the suggested minimum requirements.
  - c. Assign squad leaders or coaches to ensure the shooters maintain a "social distance" to and from trap pads, and while moving on the trap pad. This distancing needs to be maintained as they move away from trap fields and return to their vehicles to abide by the rules. No congregating on club property after the squad finishes shooting.
  - d. Start times may be staggered by up to 10 minutes by trap pad to limit potential of congregation and crowding when moving to or from the trap pads.
  - e. No sharing of equipment between athletes is allowed, and all are required to sanitize hands before and after competition.
  - f. Coaches or instructors who are providing individual instruction to shooters must wear a face mask and nitrile gloves, and only approach the shooter with the shooter's permission, and then only close enough to make clear or rectify the instructional or safety issue being addressed.
